- Meet or exceed our AIP targets of:

 - 100% students above National Minimum Standard (NMS) in all NAPLAN areas
 - NAPLAN Reading: Year 3 - 60% U2B; Year 5 - 60% U2B
 - NAPLAN Writing: Year 3 - 50% U2B; Year 5 – 30% U2B
- Continue to build intentional collaboration opportunities for staff for professional development and action-research on student outcome improvements
- Release teachers to engage in pedagogical practice cycles of inquiry
- Purchase additional teacher aide time to for targeted intervention in literacy
